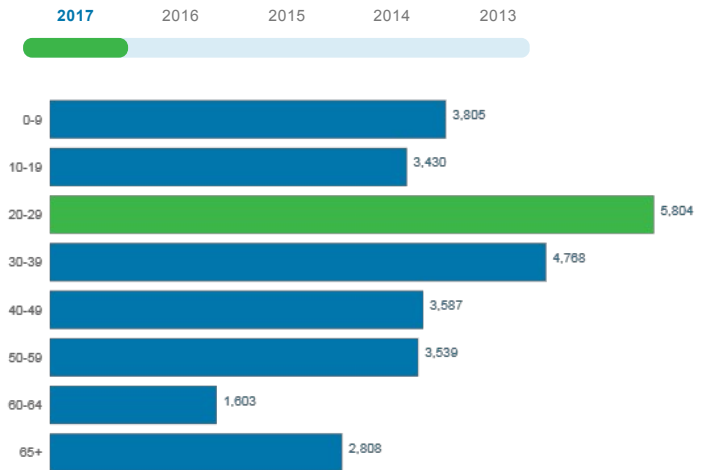

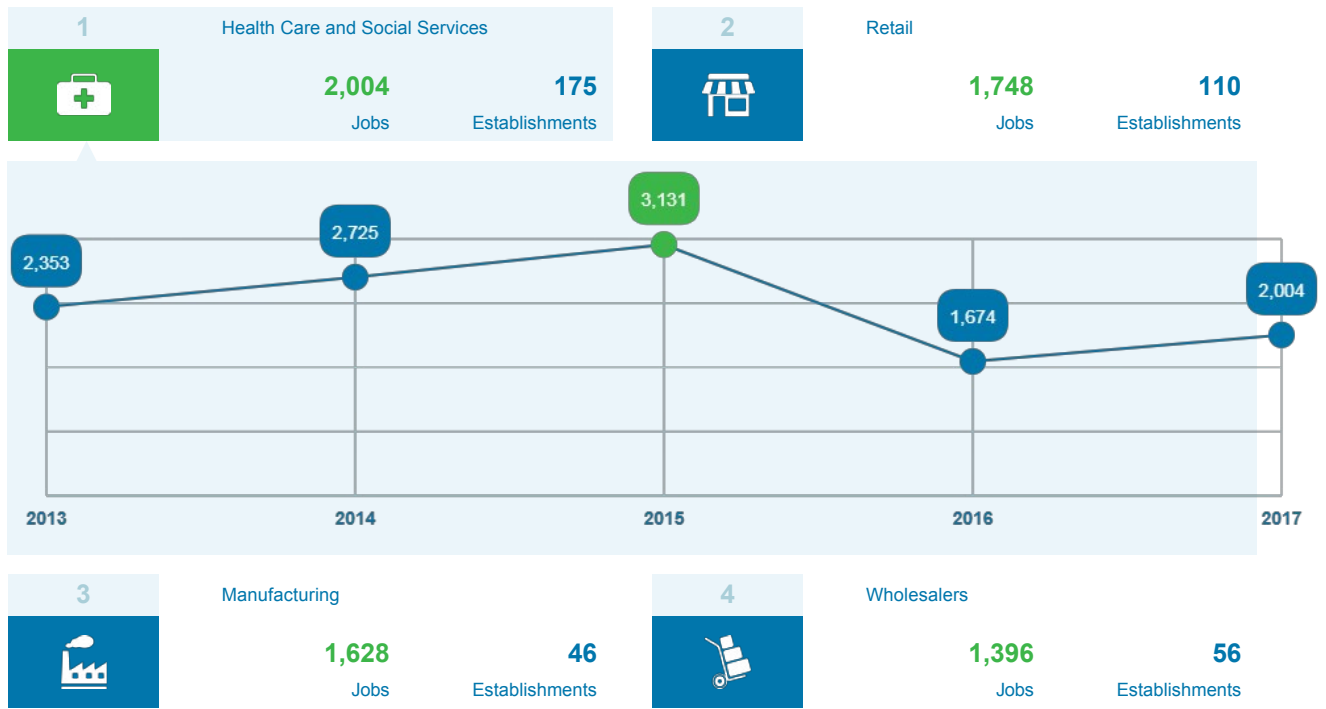

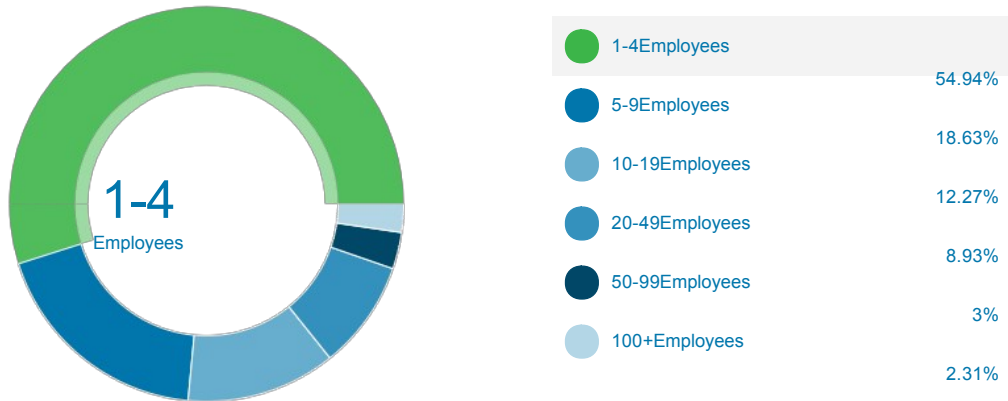

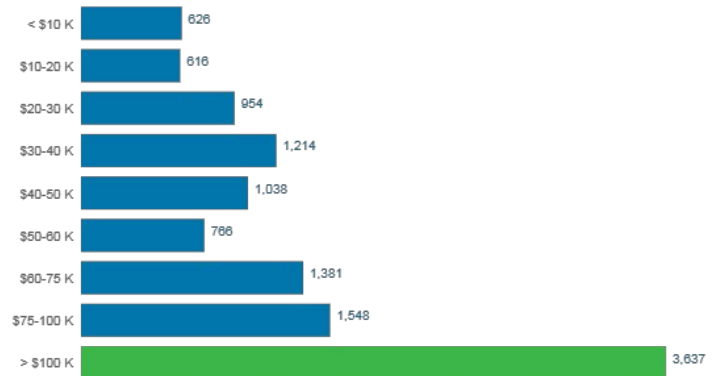

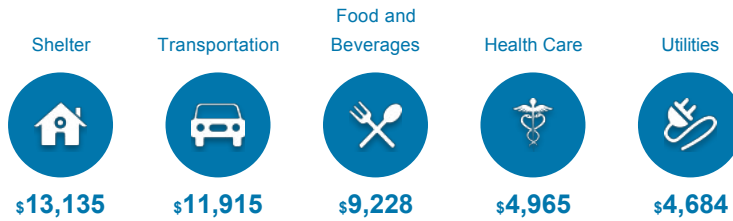

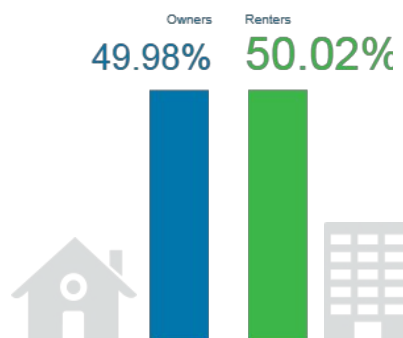

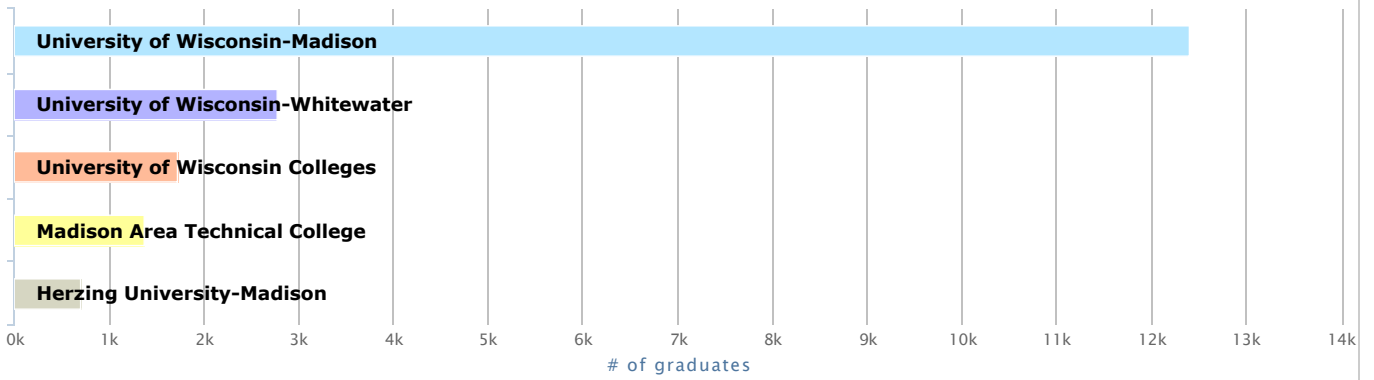

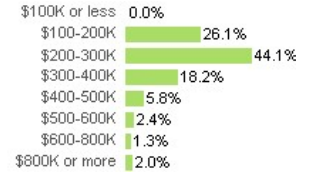

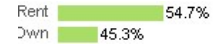
Home Value Index Distribution
